One such is his memory of his first blooding in the Mutiny: My pay sergeant, Donovan, got another round shot, which took off his right arm high up at the shoulder, and the arm caught the adjutant, Coghill, right in the face. This incident, which when remembered in cold blood, is sufficiently horrible, seemed to me at the moment to be to be very amusing. After his Indian service, Harris was sent to China where he took part in the storming of the Taku forts and the looting of Pekin (today s Beijing) which won him his nickname China Jim from the amount of precious booty - including jewels, jade, and roills of...
